English Summer Reading and Assignments:

Both assignments are averaged together as one test grade for English. The averages are listed below.

- 1. **50%** The Giver by Lois Lowry
 - Complete a typed essay (See directions on page 2.)
- 2. **50% Personal Choice Book** from a Christian author (min 100 pages)
 - Fiction or Non Fiction (See suggested author list provided.)
 - This may NOT be a book you have read previously for school.
 - Create a book jacket for your novel. (See directions on page 2.)

Bible Summer Reading:

- 1. Genesis, Holy Bible
 - As you read, please keep a chart of each time the phrase "These are the generations of..." is used. In your chart, write down what follows the phrase and the reference. For example:

"These are the generations of the heavens and the earth" – Genesis 2:4

7th Gr. Summer Reading Essay for *The Giver*

Would you recommend this book to a friend? Why or why not?

Write an essay answering this question. You must have three reasons to support your answer using evidence from the book. Begin your essay with an introduction, introducing the book and stating if you would recommend the book to a friend to read. Then you need to have three body paragraphs. Each paragraph should give a reason why you would or why you would not recommend this book. In each paragraph give a specific example from the book to support your answers. Lastly, end with a concluding paragraph. Essays should be typed, double-spaced, 12 point font in Times New Roman or Georgia.

7th Gr. Summer Reading Book Jacket for Personal Choice Book

<u>Front Cover</u>: Must include title, author and some artwork appropriate to the book.

<u>Spine:</u> Must include title and author. Remember that when a book lies flat on a table, you can still read the title right-side-up!

<u>Back Cover:</u> Must include a 50-100 word summary of the story. This summary is in your own words. Mention the main characters, the historical setting and a plot summary.

<u>Inside Flaps</u>: On one flap write a review of the book. These can be serious or funny, but they may not be taken from the actual book. These reviews are in your own words.
