English Summer Reading and Assignments:

Both assignments are averaged together as one test grade for English. The averages are listed below.

1. **50%** A book, of your choice, based on the **Holocaust**. It can be fiction or non-fiction, but must be at least 150 pages long. You may not read *The Diary of Anne Frank* which will be read as a class.

Oral Presentation: Your oral report must be 3-5 minutes. You must include the author, the title, a summary of the plot, and your personal recommendation. State whether you recommend this book, why or why not? You may use notecards!

2. **50% Historical Fiction:** Choose **either** of these two novels:

Johnny Tremain by Esther Forbes **OR** *Fever 1793* by Laurie Halse Anderson

Journal: In a spiral notebook or composition book, keep a diary as you read your book. For each chapter, you must write two paragraphs. The first paragraph needs to be a summary of the chapter. The second paragraph needs to be your reaction, your feelings, questions you have etc.

Be prepared the first day of school to share your oral report with the class and to tell about your personal choice book.



Bible Summer Reading:

1. Genesis, *Holy Bible*

- As you read, please keep a chart of each time the phrase “These are the generations of...” is used. In your chart, write down what follows the phrase and the reference. For example:

“*These are the generations of the heavens and the earth*” – Genesis 2:4

- **This will count as one quiz grade.**
